Parental Awareness of Child and Young Person Protection

Middletown Centre for Autism gives highest priority to the safety and welfare of children and young people who access our Learning Support and Assessment Service.

In all contact with children and young people staff in Middletown Centre for Autism follow the guidelines and procedures described in the Department of Education Northern Ireland (DENI) publication 'Safeguarding and Protection in Schools - 2019'

Incidents which occur at school

Disclosure/concerns regarding abuse or neglect

School Designated Teacher for child protection informed

Principal and MCA informed, plan of action formed. Advice from Education Authority/Social Services may be sought

No referral, parents informed of concerns | Referral made to PSNI/Gateway

School continue to monitor the child or young person as appropriate

Incidents which occur in 'out of school' contexts

Disclosure/concerns regarding abuse or neglect

MCA Designated Teacher informed or MCA Deputy Designated Teacher(s)

Plan of action formed. Advice from Education Authority/Social Services may be sought

No referral, parents informed of concerns | Referral made to PSNI/Gateway

If an allegation is against a parent then safeguarding team discuss with Gateway/PSNI on how to inform the parent.

MCA continue to monitor the child or young person as appropriate
